

## TEMPORARY TRAFFIC MANAGEMENT ORDER, VARIOUS ROADS, WEYMOUTH

DORSET COUNCIL has issued an Order under Section 14 [1] of the Road Traffic Regulations Act 1984 as amended. The Order is needed in order to comply with health and safety regulations which require the provision of safe working areas and to minimise likelihood of danger to highway users.

The Order comes in to operation on 21 May 2024 and will remain in force for 18 months, however it is anticipated that the works will be completed by 5 June 2024. Hours of operation will be between 0500 - 1700.

This Order will enable Dorset Council to carry out surface dressing works.

The effect of this Order will be:

- [1] To impose temporary road closure and clearway on Friar Waddon Road from its junction with B3159 for approximately 1400metres.
- [2] To impose temporary road closure and clearway on Plaisters Lane between its junctions with Coombe Valley Road and Sutton Road.
- [3] To impose temporary road closure and clearway on Sutton Road between its junctions with Plaisters Lane and Preston Road.
- [4] To impose temporary 10mph speed limit and clearway on Westhill Road to facilitate convoy working.

Any vehicle in contravention of any restriction imposed by this Notice may be removed under the provisions of the Removal and Disposal of Vehicles Regulations 1986. If a vehicle has been towed the owner will need to contact our towing contractors Ashleywood Recovery Ltd/Bride Valley Recovery Ltd on 01305 889421.

A locally signed diversion route will be put in place to enable traffic to travel around the closed sections.
