 Aims and objectives of your organisation; What does your organisation do and how does it benefit the residents of Weymouth?

Our Charitable object: The relief of those in need by reason of disability through powerboating in the interests of social welfare and the object of improving their conditions of life.

Our Vision: To ensure everyone can access the water with a safe, barrier free, enriching experience.

Environmental Policy: Our Environmental and sustainability policy outlines our ongoing commitment wherever possible to help protect and preserve our coastline. Additionally, our new lifejackets are made from recycled materials demonstrating our commitment to the environment.

Funding provided by the Council will be resticted soley to disabled residents of Weymouth and their families to enable them to get to sea to experience the thrill of a high speed boat.

All participants have the opportunity to drive, and we have specialist adapted controls to make this possible for people with impaired mobility, vision, or height restrictions. This includes those people whose disabilities are of a profound and complex nature. We believe no other organisation in the world can deliver a comparable experience to a Wetwheels trip. The experience is fast, fun and fully inclusive.

This builds the confidence of disabled people, expands their horizons and opens their minds to new possibilities. It also demonstrates to able-bodied people what disabled people are capable of in a well-designed, supportive environment.

- Where does your organisation meet? We are based in Hamble, Hants but run outreach to Portlkand/Weymouth annually based at the Wymouth & Portland Sailing Accadamy.
- How often do you meet? We operate daily during the boating season (April to October)
- How many members does your organisation have? We have 2 part time staff and 66 volunteers providing the service.
- How many people will benefit from this funding? Last year we took 2600 people to sea.
- How many of these are Weymouth Town Council area residents? Our Outreach this year saw 140 local people go to sea with Wetwheels Hamble. Any funding provided would be restricted to Weymouth residents ie 100%
- How much funding are you applying for? £2000
- What is the total cost of your project? £7000

Briefly describe the project or purchase you would like the funding for:

As you may recall Wetwheels Hamble applied for a grant to support our Outreach in Portland/Weymouth in July this year but was unsuccessful.

In order to avoid confusion and hopefully secure support in 2025 I would like to confirm that:

Any support given by the Town Council will be used solely to support residents of Weymouth. In addition from the very successful Outreach conducted from Portland this year we saw 140 people coming out with us many of whom accessed the refreshment facilities based at the WPSA, many of which I assume would have used Weymouth outlets. Indeed many of our guests were Weymouth residents.

In addition, Wetwheels Hamble is not a private business to make profits. We are a CIC (Community Interest Company) with a clear Constitutional goal of regenerating any surpluses back into the organisation for the benefit of the community.

While our outreach to Portland & Weymouth was again a success, as reflected in the local Weymouth Echo, (Wetwheels Hamble host outings in Weymouth and Portland | Dorset Echo), we found the expenditure to be a significant draw on our resourses.

Accordingly, while we are keen to again conduct Outreach in 2025 and there is a clear demand by local people we do not feel we are able to do so without some contribution from a local funder.

I therefore write to enquire at this early stage if the Council may be minded to support us in 2025.

Our aim would be to take approx 200 to sea during our time at Weymouth
