A new kind of writing festival, BankFest is aimed at inspiring, informing and coaching local young people in Weymouth with an interest in and talent for writing. The festival is completely free and is for 14-19 year olds with a focus on those children who may not normally have access to these types of events. We are working with Budmouth Academy and Atlantic school, alongside two other schools, one in Beaminster and the other in Bridport. The festival lasts for three days and each day we have 150 young people attending. We will invite established writers of all kinds -interviewers, memoirists, speechwriters, reviewers, lyricists, poets, scriptwriters, business writers to work with these young people, developing their skills, boosting their confidence and expanding their horizons. Through interviews (transmitted as podcasts), workshops, filmed and live performance and discussion, and the sharing of work with peers and writers internationally, BankFest will explore writing as a cathartic, life-enhancing process, and a way to make a life and indeed, a living. At a time when our young people are facing a deepening mental health crisis, BankFest offers its young participants a combination of creative self-expression and a different way of thinking about the world, their place in it, and how they might live their lives. We ran the festival for the first time last year in Bridport and have learned so much from the young people who attended and how to make improvements for next year, with the main element being to include the young people even earlier in the whole programming aspect and to have them do more of the actual interviewing of the professionals on stage. As a charity our current model is to work more in Weymouth with the intention of eventually having a high street presence to run our workshops year round. This will be our second year of running the festival and the goal is to attract more corporate sponsors which will lessen the need for grants in future years.
