

INTRODUCTION

Weymouth is proud to be part of the story of the ANZACs of World War 1. Over 100 years ago, the first ANZAC soldiers evacuated from Gallipoli arrived at Burdon's Military Hospital, now the Prince Regent Hotel to recover from their physical and mental scars. They were the first of nearly 120,000 ANZACs to pass through Weymouth until 1919.

Sadly 90 ANZACs died in Weymouth and are buried in war graves in cemeteries around the town.

Today, we call out the names of two of their soldiers to represent those who rest here, far away from home.

1608 Private Ralph Henshaw, 12 Battalion Australian Infantry, who died in March 1916 aged 20 and now rests in Weymouth cemetery.

16/567 Private Hapi Christie, New Zealand Maori contingent, who died in February 1916 aged 25 and now rests in Melcombe Regis Cemetery.

We are here to remember their sacrifice, and that of all the ANZACS who came to Weymouth.
